How I was Introduced to Triumph Sports Cars

Well, the indoctrination to this British lunacy started with my mom. She owned an MG Midget back in the 60's. She's actually kind of a car herself as she's owned a 70's hot pink Sunbeam Alpine, a '66 Mustang and now at 68 has an Ernie Bauer Explorer and a new F150 pickup.

Back to my Triumph story. I was fresh out of college and a brand-new USAF Second Lieutenant. I joined the Air Force and for my first assignment they sent me to an army post in Virginia, Ft. Lee AFS. It was a NORAD Regional Radar Control Facility. I was in the market for a new car (had to get in debt!) and definitely wanted a sports car.

I was never a Vette guy, didn't like the Datsuns back then, so my choices were fairly reduced. I went shopping just up the road from where I lived in Petersburg to the capitol of Virginia, Richmond.

I looked at a couple of Alfa-Romeos and they just didn't do anything for me, nor did any Fiats. Thinking back, I can't recall exactly how I wound up at Dick Bradley's Triumph, then located in the heart of Richmond.

I went in and he showed me a TR8 sitting on the

A Unique Problem

I've owned and been driving a British sportscar since I was 18. All of them used SU carburetors. Not trying to start a religious war here, but I consider the SU carburetor to be the best downdraft carb for English cars. No surprise I converted my TR6 from Stromberg's to dual SU HS6's. They are simple and effective, and very tuneable. (Opinion: Stromberg's were just different enough from SU's to get around SU's patents, and generally are not as adjustable as the SU's, at least in the versions that came over to North America).

So there I am, dual SU HS6 carb setup, enjoying my TR6 on **Drive Your Triumph Day**, cruising to the HCTC Breakfast meeting; then out to the airport to pick up Kim; then over to Blanco to meet the rest of the club; then home — a drive of 180 miles. One important part of this story — it was bucketing rain, especially on the way home when the deluge dropped 2+ inches of rain in a little over an hour.

We completed the drive home, parked the car in the garage — yep, rode hard and put away wet — and went about the rest of our day after the drive.

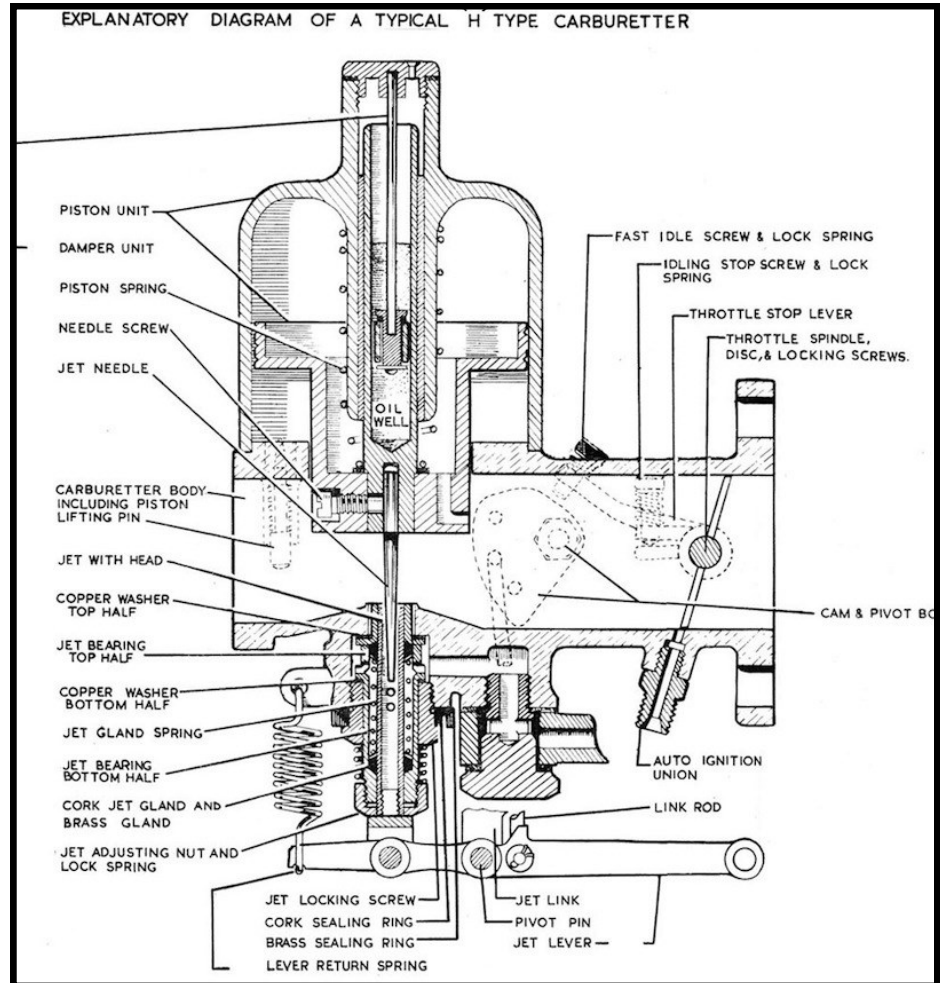
The next morning I went out to start the car to take it out for some gas and an errand ... and ... the car would start but was running exceptionally rough and would not idle up. In fact, if you gave it too much gas it would stall. You could smell the gas in the exhaust.

So I popped the hood and began my check of Fuel; Fire; Timing. Hoses all connected? Check. Getting fuel / fuel bowl full? Check. Spark plugs? Check. Distributor? Check. Linkage? Check. Choke cable? Check. Air leak? Nope. Blown head gasket? Nope. Call Mike McPhail? Check ...

After a couple of Facetime conversations and numerous trial-and-errors with no improvement, Mike told me he'd be in my area that weekend and we could look for more exotic solutions. In the meantime, Nick Roccaforte came over and we pulled my spark plugs and cleaned them ... a LOT of carbon ... but no overall improvement.

Saturday morning and Mike came along and we started the diagnostics. Ran back through the original checklist ... nothing. Then we took off the air filters to look at the dashpots and — AHA!! — we have the culprit.

Turns out moisture had built up inside the dashpots and frozen the pistons in the closed position. I can honestly say (and I'm pretty sure Mike would say it too) that in all the years of driving British cars I have **never**

encountered this before in an SU — or any other carburetor. The solution was easy. We removed the dashpots; wiped down the piston, housing, and mount; and put them back together again. Perfection once more.

In a piece of trivia (that may interest only me) Triumph started off using SU carbs, but had to pay the BMC's SU division a very high price for SU carbs. Adding insult to injury, BMC was notorious for delaying Triumph deliveries to satisfy demand on its own product lines. After years of impacted delivery dates and high fees, Triumph kicked off work on what became the Stromberg CD (CD = Constant Depression) carburetor. After successfully developing a carb that did **not** infringe on SU patents, Triumph sold the design to Stromberg with a promise to use Stromberg carbs if Stromberg could reliably mass produce the product.

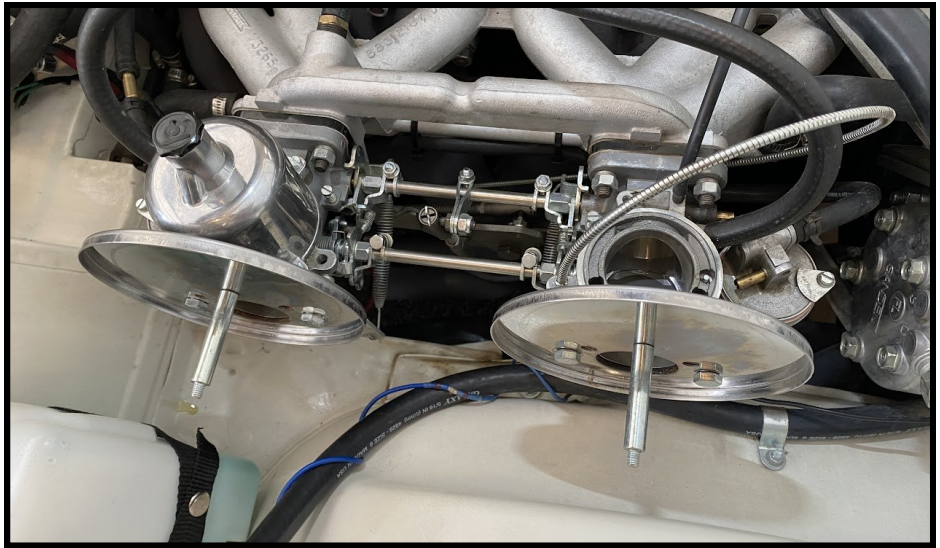
And Webber? The SU is a constant velocity carb. This means that the speed at which air flows over the jet never varies. The SU has one jet which must supply fuel during all stages of engine operation despite the fact that the engine demands different amounts of fuel and air for different situations. Everything is served by one jet, and the only possible adjustment

(normally) is to the idle mixture. There are alternative jet needles, but for any given car you have the choice of weak, normal, or rich. Per the experts, the normal needle is probably correct for 90% of all cars on the road.

Weber carbs need different jets for each stage of engine operation. Unlike the SU, the jets must be tailored to work individually AND as a group. The SU varies airflow and jet diameter on its own to meet engine requirements. The Weber cannot do this, it must be set up in advance to meet expected demands, making it more complicated, time-consuming, and difficult to tune correctly. Done right, you get better performance, but that's the real trick — it has to be done right.

After a lot of discussion, location swaps, and some false starts, it looks like the Hill Country Triumph Club has found its permanent home for the monthly Social Hour at the County Line on the Lake, located at 5204 Ranch Rd. 2222, Austin, TX.

To review, while there has been a long Hill Country Triumph Club tradition of meeting at the Tavern, the downtown rush-hour traffic and competition with other clubs for seating led us to seek an alternate venue that would be centrally-located for all members.

The County Line on the Lake location, just around the corner from the Waterloo Icehouse on Capitol of Texas Highway, is equidistant for most people in the Greater Austin area. Better, there are multiple routes to the venue for folks coming from the north, south and all points in-between.

Attending the inaugural Social Hour were some 14 members of HCTC. What we found was a venue long on hospitality; good food; and great service. The food portions were generous — indeed the plates were heaped with food. The Country Line on the Lake has a Happy Hour Tuesday that runs all night with discounts on Texas-label beer.

The management was very accommodating of our club, providing a flexible seating area that was semi-private. They also allowed us to come and go as needed, and provided a designated waiter to see to our needs. The County Line has ample seating, both indoor and outside, so no doubt we'll be taking advantage of the outdoor seating as the weather improves.

Along with the change of venue, we changed the start time. The targeted gathering time will be from 6:00 – 8:00 PM. That said, the Social Hour is designed as a come-and-go event so there is no specific time attendees

have to arrive or leave.

We hope to see everyone there at our next Social Hour gathering on March 12th.

Texas All British Car Days 2024



Hello and welcome to the first communication on Texas All British Car Days 2024. This article is our chance to communicate with you about the upcoming 2024 Texas All British Car Days (TX ABCD). We've made several changes this year and we hope you're as excited as we are, so we wanted to get the word out early.

Venue — Marble Falls, Texas

We listened to a lot of feedback from last year and the year before. What we heard was TX ABCD attendees wanted a venue that was:

- Easy to get to, and leave from, and get on to the higher speed Texas road system
- Refreshments — and shade — in a comfortable setting
- Things to do close to the hotel / show setting

Using this feedback as our guide, the TX ABCD Steering committee set out to look at venues. We scrutinized Dripping Springs; Georgetown; Marble Falls; Round Rock; and Salado as possible venues. After doing a full analysis, we've elected to hold the 33rd annual Texas All British Car Days show in **Marble Falls** as it met all criteria.

Texas All British Car Days format and events

Other points of feedback dealt with the show flow and format. Traditionally, we've had the Social Hour on Friday; some form of Rallye on Saturday; and the show + awards on Sunday. We listened and as a result, we're changing things up a bit this year to provide a better show experience and to align with other regional shows.

The new format of the show will be as follows:

Friday

- Social Hour
- Late Registration

Saturday

- Texas All British Car Days Show, 10:00 am to 1:00 pm
- Self-guided drives, 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm
- Cash-bar reception, 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm
- Awards banquet, 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm

Sunday

- Breakfast 8:00 am to 9:00 am
- Optional Destination drive, 9:00 am to 11:00 am

Yes, there are a few changes here. First, we're having the Car Show on Saturday, not Sunday. Second, we're having a reception and an awards banquet Saturday afternoon / evening to cap off the day. Third, we're having a breakfast on Sunday coupled with a drive. We found this format answered most — if not all — the feedback points from previous shows. It also better aligns with what other shows — Brits in the Ozarks; VTR Regionals; Brits on the Bluff; Texas All British and European Car Days — are doing with their shows.

The Importance of Early Registration

We'd really like you to register early. This helps us get accurate counts for the show, regalia, etc. To provide an incentive to you to register early, we are offering a significant discount from late and same-day registration. Registration fees will go up as the show approaches. Fee schedule:

- Early Registration, up to September 9th: \$35
- Late Registration, September 10th thru October 11th: \$40
- Same-day Registration: \$50

Same-day registration is not available at the show venue this year. Instead, same day registration will be at TX ABCD headquarters in The Hidden Falls Inn, and will run from 8:00 am to 9:30 am.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is there going to a Vendor's Corner?

A: Yes, like last year, we will be hosting vendors providing services and products to British car owners

Q: Will food and beverages be available during the show?

A: Yes, there will be both food trucks and a beverage stand selling water, soft drinks, and coffee

Q: Is there going to be a swap meet like last year?

A: No, we have decided to not continue with that

Q: How much will the Awards banquet cost?

A: At this point we do not have a cost, but we are focused on providing a quality meal at an affordable price

Q: Will Regalia be sold at the show?

A: Yes, Bits of Triumph will be at Late Registration Friday and at the show in the Vendor's Corner

Q: Can I register more than one car? Is there a discount for two or more?

A: Yes, you can register as many cars as you wish. No, there is no volume discounts.

Q: When does preferred-rate hotel registration end?

A: The Hidden Falls Inn will release any unleased rooms in the TX ABCD block two weeks prior to show

Q: Do I need a ticket to attend the Awards Banquet? Can I get tickets if I register late?

A: Yes, you will need to purchase a ticket for the Awards Banquet. Yes, but only up to the day prior to show. There will be no same-day purchases.

Q: Do I need a ticket for the Breakfast?

A: TBD, we're still working out the details on this one

Q: Is there a rain-out date?

A: No, there is no rain date planned

Q: How will the cars be judged? What kind of award?

A: TX ABCD will be using a Car Class system with People's Choice voting. Awards will be for 1st; 2nd; 3rd in class. Additional awards will be handed out for Best in Show; Best Survivor; and Furthest Driven

Q: When does Registration open?

A: TX ABCD will be using CarShow Pro again this year for registration. We anticipate Registration opening in late March or early April.
