I found a bit of whimsical humor for this month's archive article. Although the advice given is tongue in cheek, there is some truth hiding between the words. This article is from the November 1999 issue of "The Ragtop"

10 Best Tools of All Time

Forget the Snap-On Tools truck, it's never been there when you need it. Besides there are only 10 things in this world you need to fix any car, any place, any time.

1. Duct Tape - Not just a tool, a veritable Swiss Army knife in stickum and plastic. Its safety wire, body material, radiator hose, upholstery, insulation, tow rope, and more in an easy to carry package. Sure, There's prejudice surrounding duct tape in concours competitions, but in the real world, everything from LeMans winning Porches to Atlas rockets use it by the yard. Nature doesn't know the bent metal panel or frozen exhaust pipe that can stand up to a good bonking stick. (Can also be used to separate tie-rod ends in a pinch, of course, but does a lousy job of it).

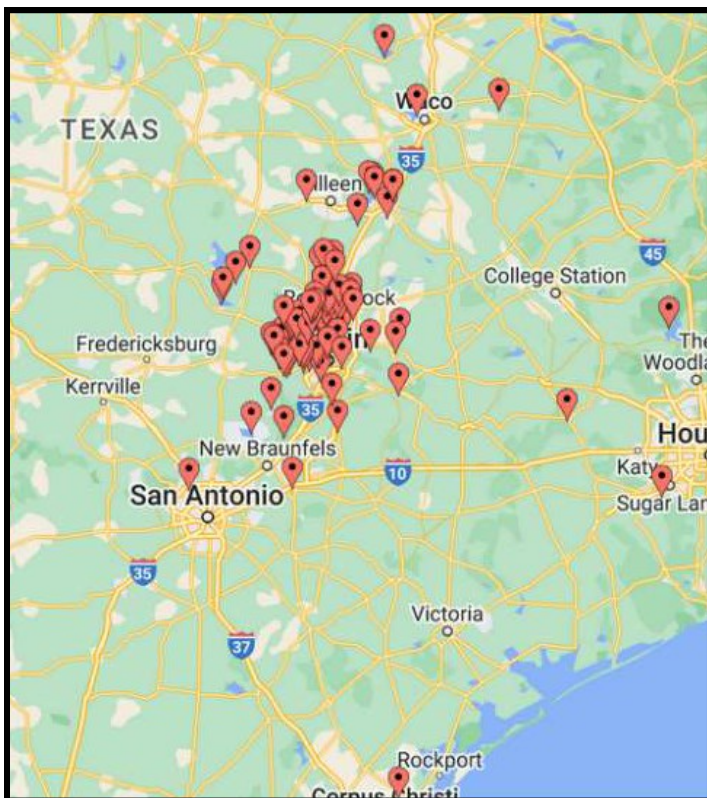
Our membership encompasses a wide geographical area. We have members in Spain and a couple of out-of-state members. Within Texas we range from Dallas

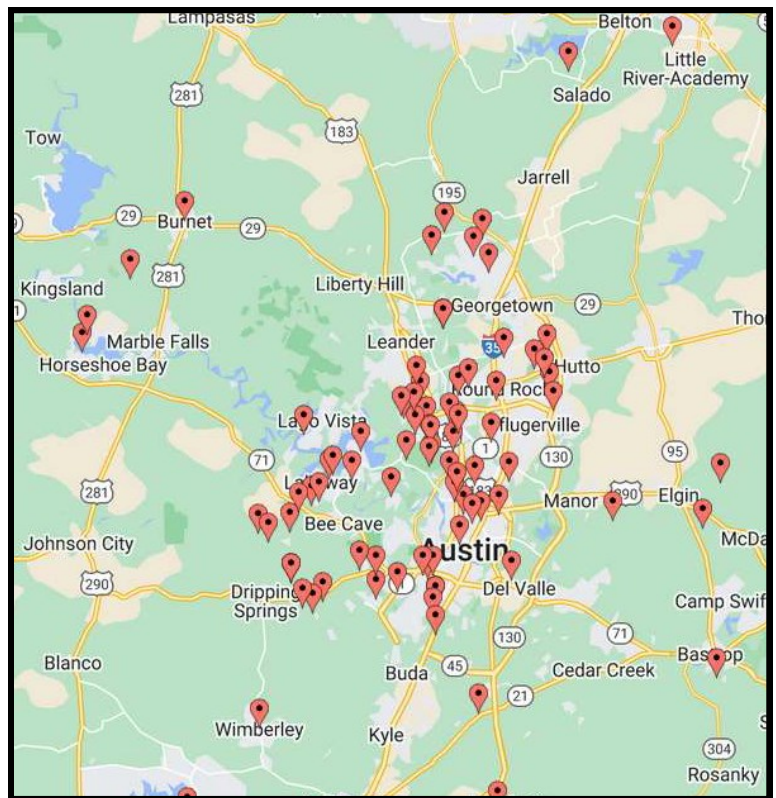

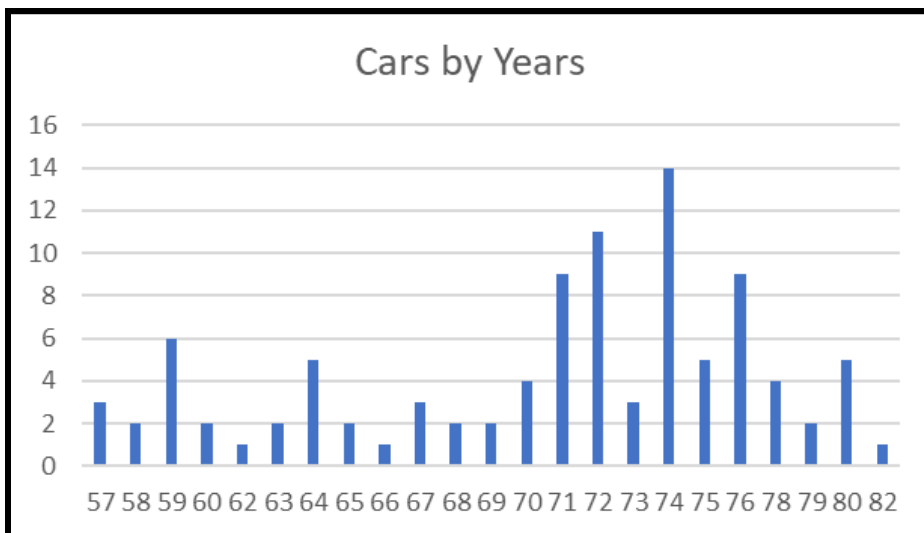

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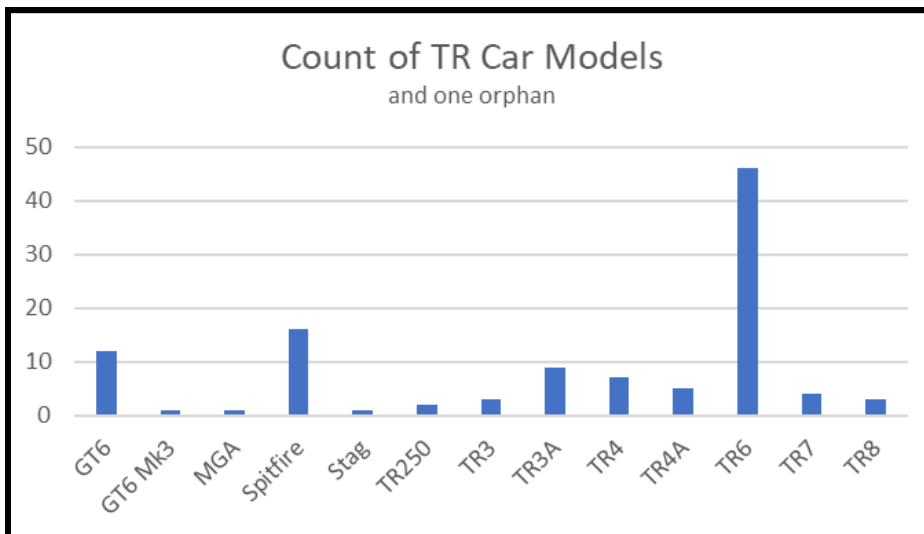

for drive and activities, Thursday through Saturday.

Thursday dawned with near perfect driving weather — high blue skies and temperatures in the low to mid - 70's. There were two driving events to choose from: A poker run / winery tour; and a Gearhead Tour. Mike and Art took the Gearhead Tour; Kim and I chose the Poker Run / Winery Tour.

On our drive — some 40 miles out in the winding hill country of Missouri — had three stops where we picked up playing cards to compliment the initial card we drew at the start. At the fifth stop, the Montello Winery, we drew our last card and then compared poker hands with everyone else (We had four-fifths of a straight, but busted on the last draw).

Once at the Montello Winery we took in a great lunch, some interesting local wines, and unbelievable views from a huge deck out back of the winery .

Thursday night was the official Welcome Reception at the hotel, followed by a dinner run to St. Charles.

Bob Skewis and Bill Waller pulled in Thursday afternoon rounding out the Hill Country contingent in St. Louis.

Friday was the same weather as Thursday — just gorgeous and perfect driving weather ... and it needed to be because Friday was Autocross; LeMans Start; and Funkhana. All three events were in the same venue but given some late starts and confusion, we were only able to participate in the Autocross.

The course, set up by the local SCCA Club, featured multiple turns and twists and was quite challenging. Mike McPhail and Kim Welter were the only two HCTC entrants. Mike posted respectable times but the Men's Modified Six Class was stacked with some fast, super-tuned cars that hadn't just driven 800 miles to get there. Kim, in the Women's Stock Six Class, logged her second consecutive 1st place in VTR Autocross events with a fantastic time of 48.02 seconds.

Immediately after the Autocross struck camp, attention turned towards the Time Speed Distance (TSD) Rally. A TSD rally, like its name implies, is trying to get a car to perform **exactly** to parameters established on the course. For example, run 2.5 miles at 35 mph followed by 4 miles at 40 mph. After each speed / distance interval, the car pulls into a checkpoint to measure accuracy, then moves on in the course.

Mike and Art did the TSD rally, whose finish line was a nice brew pub in St. Charles County. Because of the late start, those participating in the TSD Rally missed the Dinner drives that night, but Kim and Jacques caught one of those drives to a lovely Italian restaurant, led by the St. Louis chapter president, Dave Pollard.

Show Day was Saturday, and was scheduled for the parking lot of the National Transportation Museum. Unfortunately, Mother Nature did not cooperate, hammering the St. Louis area with thunderstorms and showers, and the show was forced under cover in the host hotel parking garage. Despite this the show was enjoyed by all who attended. Bob Skewis took home a 2nd in Peoples Choice with his TR250;

Bill Waller took home a 3rd in Concours Stock with his TR6; and Art Graves took home an Emeritus award with his TR6.

After the show, it was time to relax, let your hair down, take a final drive, and get ready for the Awards Banquet that night.

After trophy's and recognition, it was time to talk about VTR

Nationals in Nashville, Indiana, and announce the venue for the next VTR Regionals. The 2025 South Central Regionals will be held in Waco, Texas, and will run either in late April or early May.

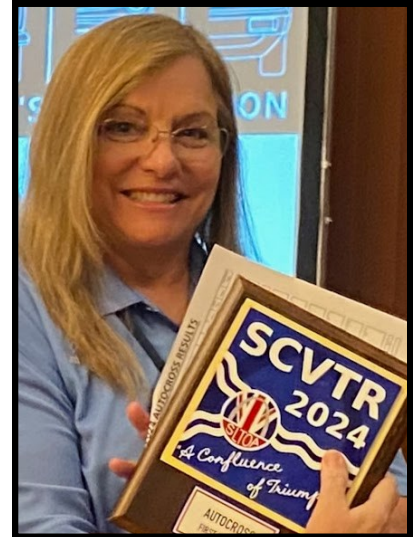

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is there going to a Vendor's Corner?

Q: Is there going to be a swap meet like last year?

A: Tickets are \$35 per person

Q: Will Regalia be sold at the show?

A: Yes, Bits of Triumph will be at Late Registration Friday and at the show in the Vendor's Corner

A: Yes, you can register as many cars as you wish. No, there is no volume discounts.

Q: When does preferred-rate hotel registration end?

A: The Hidden Falls Inn will release any unleased rooms in the TX ABCD block two weeks prior to show

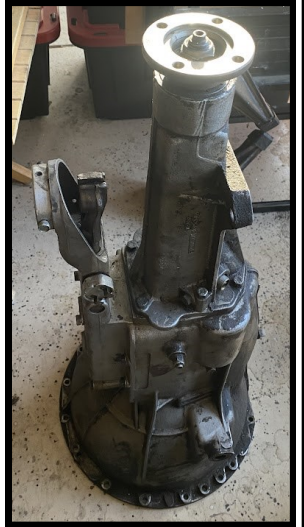
